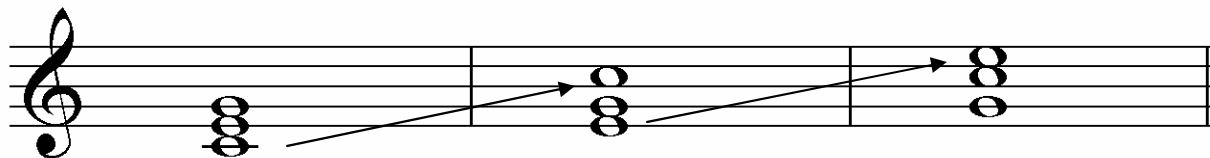


Inversions and Figured Bass

Here's your friendly Mr. C Major Triad:



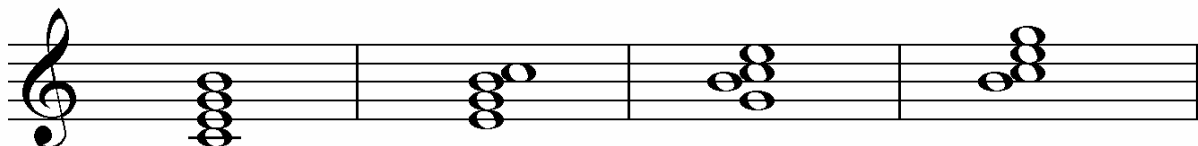
Write out the notes of the chords and figure out which note is in the bass:

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

5. To Thee, great One in Three, E-ter-nal prais-es be, hence, ev-er-more;




Fa-ther all glo-ri-ous, o'er all vic-to-ri-ous, Come and reign o-ver us, An-cient of Days!

Thy sov-erign maj-es-ty may we in glo-ry see, And to e-ter-ni-ty love and a-dore!




1. Ho-ly, ho-ly, ho-ly, Lord Al-might-y!
